(8:04p) Motion is made by the Chair and seconded to adopt the Agenda. Motion passes without objection.

Chair’s Report: (8:05p) Chair reports that we need to get our ReOpen LA billboard up. Sean Hernandez will be running data analytics for us. No prison time was given Nikolas Wildstar in no small part to the letters written on behalf of Nikolas' character. Chair reports on New Hampshire group charged with crypto-currency violations. Angela had appeared on one of the podcast during Porcfest this past year. The LPC of Orange County has asked for volunteers to help with their Libertarian booth at the upcoming gunshow. Chair spoke at the Alabama LP State Convention and spoke about our efforts here in Los Angeles County.

Electronic Motions passed since our January 2021 Executive Committee Meeting

A motion has been made by the the Chair that we pass the following resolution regarding Nikolas Wildstar. The motion has ten days to pass only if a majority of the Board approves.

- Whereas Nickolas Wildstar was unanimously nominated for governor by the Libertarian Party of California in 2018, and many members of the Libertarian Party voted for him;
- Whereas Nickolas Wildstar has demonstrated that he is a valuable member of the liberty movement in Southern California;
- Whereas Nickolas Wildstar was an active leader in California's black lives matter movement;
- Whereas Nickolas Wildstar offered support to Stephan Clark's family in the aftermath of that tragic shooting;
- Whereas Nickolas Wildstar is a personal friend of many members of the Libertarian Party of Los Angeles County;
- Whereas Nickolas Wildstar has demonstrated he is an excellent father and role model to his young son;
- Whereas California's liberty community has benefited from Nickolas Wildstar's liberty activism;
- Whereas California's liberty community would suffer a great loss and great role model if Nickolas Wildstar were to be incarcerated;

Therefore, be it resolved that the Libertarian Party of Los Angeles County recommends that Nickolas Wildstar be shown leniency by the Court and that his sentencing should not include any prison sentence or jail time. Voting started as of 7:30pm PST February 24th. Voting closed at 7:29pm PST March 6, 2021.
